

Paul E. Sirbaugh, DO, MBA

During his almost 30 years as faculty at the Baylor College of Medicine Dr. Sirbaugh provided over 40,000 hours of clinical care to patients and 30,000 hours of education to medical students, residents and fellows at TCH. He also served as the Houston Fire Department's (HFD) first and only pediatric-specific Emergency Medical Services (EMS) medical director for over 25 years where he logged more than 150,000 hours of online medical direction, participated in the prehospital resuscitation of approximately 2500 children and provided education and quality oversight of countless prehospital providers. He is active in the emergency management preparation, response, recovery and mitigation involving numerous events including Allison, Katrina, Rita, Ike, H1N1, Harvey and COVID-19. In 2012, he was named the Division Chief of Emergency Medicine and during his tenure, witnessed growth in faculty, fellows, patients, programs, revenue, research, technology and facilities. In 2017, he accepted the role of Chief Medical Officer for TCH The Woodlands (TW), an opportunity that depends heavily on collaboration, trust and influence with the providers and administration as we together lead the Texas Children's mission for the Woodland's and North Region. Mid-pandemic he was promoted to Professor of Pediatrics at BCM and earned the 2020 BCM Master Clinician Award for Excellence in Patient Care for his contributions through clinical excellence, leadership, mentoring, clinical innovation and continuous service to the Baylor community. Of note, he reached the pinnacle of his career when he was accepted into the LMC Class of 2022.
