

SARAH BLAKELOCK, DIRECTOR OF COMMUNICATIONS, CONROE ISD



Sarah Blakelock currently serves as the Director of Communications for Conroe Independent School District. She began her career with Conroe ISD in 2010 when she was hired as the Early Childhood Specialist for the Curriculum and Instruction Department. During her time in Conroe ISD, she has also served as the Gifted Programs Specialist.

Mrs. Blakelock began her career in education in 2002 as a kindergarten teacher for Lubbock ISD followed by Fairfax County Public Schools in Virginia. During this time, she earned her National Board Certification as an early childhood generalist. Upon leaving the classroom, Mrs. Blakelock was an education policy analyst for the Government Accountability Office in Washington, D.C.

In addition to serving in CISD, Mrs. Blakelock is a graduate of Leadership Montgomery County Class of 2016 and the current chairman of the board. In 2022, she was named a Woman of Distinction for Leadership Montgomery County. Mrs. Blakelock is a member of the Greater Houston Women's Chamber of Commerce, Executive Women's Alliance, Texas School Public Relations Association, and National School Public Relations Association. DR. BETHANY MEDFORD, DEPUTY SUPERINTENDENT, CONROE ISD



Conroe ISD Deputy Superintendent, Dr. Bethany Medford is a dedicated leader with deep roots in the Conroe community. She has spent 20 of her 23 years in education in CISD. Dr. Medford began her teaching career in Pasadena ISD where she taught second and fourth grades before moving to Conroe in 2002.

She began her career in Conroe at Peet Junior High where she taught and coached volleyball, basketball, and track. She has also served as Assistant Principal at Runyan Elementary, Principal at Bozman and Cryar Intermediates and Assistant Superintendent for Middle Schools.

Dr. Medford earned her bachelor's degree from the University of Houston in 1999 and was a member of the volleyball team. She then attended Lamar University where she earned her master's degree and doctorate degree in Educational Leadership.

In addition to her leadership in Conroe ISD, Dr. Medford has served in many volunteer capacities at Stonebridge Church where she's been a member since 2008. Dr. Medford has twin daughters, Kenedi and Kaiden, who are seniors at Conroe High School, a nephew at Galatas Elementary and a niece who is a Lil' Lander at The Woodlands High School.

DR. CURTIS NULL, SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS, CONROE ISD



Dr. Curtis Null became Superintendent of Schools in June of 2018. He has served 23 years in education with 21 of those years in Conroe ISD.

Dr. Null earned his bachelor's degree from the University of Houston in 1998. Upon completion of his undergraduate degree, he attended the University of Florida and earned a master's degree in 2000 with an emphasis in Sports Medicine while working directly with the Florida Gator football team.

In 2000, Dr. Null began his career in Conroe ISD at The Woodlands High School where he served as a teacher and athletic trainer for three years. During this time, he continued his education at Sam Houston State University earning his principal certification. In 2006, Dr. Null was named principal of Peet Junior High. In 2010, he was named principal of Conroe High School. That same year, he also

completed his superintendent certification at Sam Houston State University. Dr. Null earned his doctorate degree in professional leadership from the University of Houston in 2012. In December of 2013, Dr. Null was named Assistant Superintendent for Secondary Education. He became the Deputy Superintendent of Schools in January of 2016.

Under Dr. Null's leadership, Conroe ISD has continued to receive the highest rating from Texas Smart Schools, formerly known as the FAST report, for high academic achievement while maintaining cost-effective operations. Conroe ISD is one of only two districts in the State to receive this recognition for 13 consecutive years. The District has also received the highest recognition for transparency from the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts for 11 years in a row. According to the Education Resource Group, Conroe ISD ranks in the top 10 of the 200 largest school districts in Texas for academic and financial performance, ranking held for over a decade, and has one of the lowest tax rates in the Houston metropolitan area. In 2020, Conroe ISD was recognized The Rotary Club of The Woodlands with a Community Hero Award. In 2021, Conroe ISD was named a Top Workplace by the Houston Chronicle. Forbes named Conroe ISD as one of America's Best-in-State Employers for Texas in 2022. Conroe ISD was also named a 2023 Hometown Hero by Interfaith of The Woodlands.

In addition to his District responsibilities as superintendent, Dr. Null volunteers on numerous educational and civic boards and committees, including the Junior Achievement Board of Southeast Texas, the Montgomery County Food Bank Board of Directors, the Montgomery County Public Health District Board, the Conroe/Lake Conroe Area Chamber of Commerce, The Woodlands Area Chamber of Commerce, the Conroe Economic Development Council, and the Education for Tomorrow Alliance. Dr. Null is a graduate of the Leadership Montgomery County class of 2015, and, in 2020, was named Texas Counseling Association Layperson of the Year. In 2021, he received Leadership Montgomery County's Distinguished Alumnus Award. In 2022, Dr. Null received the Community Citizen of the Year award from The Woodlands Area Chamber of Commerce.

Dr. Null is married to Tanya, who teaches prekindergarten in the District. They have two children, Travis and Kailey, who are both graduates of Conroe ISD.



DR. JASON BULLOCK, DEPUTY SUPERINTENDENT, MAGNOLIA ISD



Dr. Jason Bullock joined Magnolia ISD as Assistant Superintendent for Administration in 2012. He was named Deputy Superintendent in 2020. He is responsible for the day-to-day operations of the district and oversees district administration. He is also responsible for district policy, principal mentorship, and leadership development.

Dr. Bullock previously worked in Temple ISD serving in several positions during his time there including high school history teacher, department chair, advanced academic coordinator, Principal of Temple High School, and finally Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum and Instruction. He was named the Texas Foreign Language Association Secondary Administrator of the Year for 2011.

Dr. Bullock was born in Houston, Texas, and grew up in Jackson, Mississippi. He holds BA and MA Degrees in History from Abilene Christian University where he also played baseball. Dr. Busby received her bachelor's degree in Academic Studies from Sam Houston State University in 2001 and continued her education with a master's degree in educational leadership in 2004 and Doctorate Degree in Educational Leadership in 2019, both from Sam Houston State.

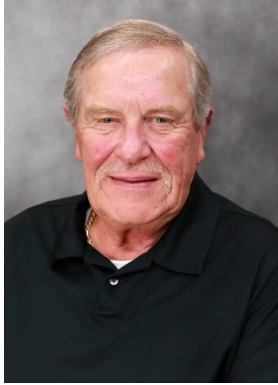
